Nearly Christmas time!

We would like to thank all the consumers that were involved in the community care audit. We are always keen to learn and improve on service delivery and appreciate your involvement and feedback. We want to ensure all clients and families of clients are happy with the service they are being provided with, we always welcome feedback about the service and there are many ways to provide this feedback, including the feedback form attached. You can obtain a copy from the centre, email form back to cnc@bundaberg.qld.gov.au, hand it into your care worker or drop it into the centre.

Isis Community care is in the process of going out to tender for a few of the community care programs, domestic assistance, home maintenance and meals on wheels as all current contracts are due to expire.

Isis Community Care shuts down for the week over Christmas, Meals On Wheels are not delivered on public holidays, as Christmas day falls on a Monday and boxing day on the Tuesday, anyone wanting meals for the Monday will need to order an extra frozen meal to be delivered on Friday the 22 December. Meals will be delivered again on Wednesday the 27 and Friday the 29 December.

New Years Day is again falling on a Monday, so meals won't be delivered until the following day, which is Tuesday 2 January 2024.

If you are a recipient of Meals On Wheels, please ensure you have let the Neighbourhood Centre know if you are not going to be home for your delivery. If MOW is being delivered and the MOW volunteers cannot make contact with you in person, via the phone or any other way they will contact the Neighbourhood Centre and a welfare check may be sought to ensure your safety.


