Gin Gin to Wallaville - New Water Transfer Pipeline

Issue No.1– January 2024

What is happening?

Installation of a new Water Main pipeline from Gin Gin to supply potable water to the township of Wallaville and construction of a booster pump station at Wallaville, works include;

- Stage 1 (completed January 2024) Water main extension in Gin Gin. (marked in red on map)
- Stage 2 (currently underway) New water main excavation and installation from Gin Gin to Wallaville. (marked in blue on map)

Impact from the works?

As the water main is for transfer only, no connections to rural properties are available.

Traffic controls and detours will be employed for the safety of the public and BRC's workers.

Wallaville's water supply is not expected to be affected by the installation of the new water main. An interruption to supply notice will be issued if this changes.

What's the Benefits?


The installation of the pipeline allows for the retirement of the Wallaville Water Treatment Plant, so that the Wallaville community is supplied potable water from the Gin Gin water treatment plant via existing local storage reticulation.
