E-Waste Electronic waste, TVs, computers, small appliances, etc.

Trickle tape (T-tape) Tight rolls - clean (excludes Ag Plastic)

Paint (wet) 20 L containers max - up to 100 L per visit

Domestic disposal only

Green waste Clean green waste only

Chemicals Containers must be 5 L or less

Fluoros Fluoro-cycle
Fluorescent tubes and bulbs, etc.

Mobile phones MobileMuster
Mobile phones and wearables

Gas bottles Must be empty

Traditional recyclables Items accepted in yellow lid recycle bin

Oils Engine and cooking oils
20 L containers max - up to 50 L per visit

Your material recycling facility (MRF)

Household recyclables from your **yellow lid wheelie bin** are delivered to the MRF which is operated by IMPACT Community Services, who provide employment and training opportunities for people who are disadvantaged in our community or have a disability.

Your recycling is sorted by hand

before being baled into the following categories: • paper • soft drink bottles • steel/aluminium cans • cardboard • milk bottles • shrink wrap • glass bottles and jars.

Tips for managing household waste

Recycling bin



- **Fold boxes** to save space
- **Remove lids** from drink bottles and containers
- **No need to crush** tins and cans
- **Rinse recyclables** for better end product
- **Never place** sharps or medical waste in your recycle bin

Please **do not bag recyclables** they are sorted by hand

General waste bin



- **Do not overfill** or jam rubbish in the bin/s
- **Do not place** large, dangerous or hazardous items in the bin
- Maximum bin weight 75 kg
- **Excessive weight = no rubbish collection**
- Free up space - **compost food and garden waste**

Place bins 30 cm apart and one metre away from other objects like cars, power poles, trees etc.
